Women Advancement Forum; International Exchanges, Research and Academia

In March 2017, the Women Advancement Forum: International Exchanges, Research & Academia (WAFIRA) - Ghana came off for the second time in Kumasi. This programmatic capacity-building workshop was conceptualized as a 3-day-training programme for female academics and researchers in 2014 and continued in 2016 with enhanced delivery in collaboration with universities in Nigeria, Benin, Ghana, Ivory Coast and Togo. The theme for WAFIRA 2017 was "Passive Role Playing vs Active Career Advancement: A Look at Women and their Academic Careers".

The three-day workshop offered all participants and facilitators great opportunities for networking and set the ball rolling for future mentoring collaborations.

The representative of the Vice-Chancellor of KNUST, the Vice-Chancellor of Koforidua Technical University, two keynote speakers (from Ghana and Germany), two additional keynote speakers, workshop facilitators and participants, invited guests and organizers of the forum participated in the workshop. The expert from Ghana delivered a keynote on 'Navigating the Academy: Appropriating Traditions, Strengthening Collaborations and Connecting Globally' while that of the expert from Germany was on 'Developing leadership skills through mentoring'. Additionally, there was a keynote address by a DAAD Alumna and lecturer at KNUST, Department of Planning on gender related issues on the host campus.

PhD proposal writing workshop 2017

The PhD proposal writing workshop is a platform especially made for prospective PhD candidates to fine-tune their research proposals for their research stays in Germany. This year, it will be a two-day event (24th and 25th of August 2017) at the University of Ghana.

Participants at the workshop will be coached by seasoned researchers and other DAAD and Germany alumni who have successfully completed their research stays in Germany. This workshop also introduces participants to the vast research landscape of Germany, available funding opportunities as well as 'how to find a research supervisor'.

Interested participants who have attained a masters degree are invited to attend. Prior application is mandatory.

DAAD Research Grants (short term / long term)

Bi-nationally supervised doctoral degree programmes

This grant is for PhD candidates pursuing their doctoral programmes in their home country to undertake a research phase at a state or state-recognised institution of higher education or a non-university research institute in Germany as part of a doctoral programme. Their research proposal must be coordinated with the academic supervisors at the home university and in Germany.

Doctoral training programme in Germany

This grant is for PhD candidates pursuing their entire doctoral programme at a state or state-recognised institution of higher education or a non-university research institute in Germany. This grant is offered for individual projects under the supervision of a university teacher or academic adviser or for participation in a structured doctoral study programme in Germany.

One-year grant

This grant is purposely for a research project or course of continuing education at a state or state-recognised institution of higher education in Germany or a non-university research institute, which is being carried out in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany for a period of 7 months to usually 10 months; the length of the grant is decided by a selection committee and depends on the project in question and the applicant's work schedule.

• Short-term grant

This grant is purposely for a research project or course of continuing education at a state or state-recognised institution of higher education or a non-university research institute in Germany, which is being carried out in coordination with an academic adviser in Germany for a period of one month to a maximum of six months; the length of the grant is decided by a selection committee and depends on the project in question and the applicant's work schedule.

Application opens in July, 2017 Deadline: by 31st October, 2017 Please check www.funding-guide.de for specific information and application instructions.

Research stays for academics and scientists

The aim of this particular programme is to support short -term research stays and thus promote the exchange of experience and networking among colleagues. University teachers and established academics and scientists who have usually completed a doctoral degree and work at a university or research institute in their home country can apply. One applies for research stays at state or state-recognised institutions of higher education or non-university research institutes in Germany . A research stay can also take place at several host insti-

tutions. The stay is usually for a period of one to three months. Visits to conferences and congresses are not funded. The application will open from July, 2017.
