

## Advice for Student Visa Interview Preparation

### **Booking for a Student Visa Interview:**

Kindly check if you are meeting the requirements for 'Category A' or 'Category B' appointment slots. Book via this [LINK](#). (Please keep a copy of the appointment confirmation you receive by e-mail)

In addition to the Checklist of the German Embassy, kindly find below further helpful advice for the personal Visa interview which is compulsory for the application process.

#### ▪ **Motivational letter/Statement**

A handwritten motivational letter is an essential part of the required documents which you will have to hand in during your personal interview appointment. When writing it, please keep it specifically to your situation. There is no need to write about Germany's economy or educational system etc. This general information is not needed. Kindly focus on the school and study programme you have admission for.

The following points can help you structuring the letter:

- Why the programme in that specific university in Germany is unique.
- Which modules would you like to focus on most.
- What do you plan to benefit from.
- Are there any research centres in your faculty which will support your study plan.
- Are there any companies in your university city or even in Germany that you feel could enhance your career (by pursuing an internship/or work in such a company)?
- Is there any professor with a very specific area of interest you wish to get close to?

#### ▪ **Personal interview**

Besides the required documents, the personal interview itself is also a crucial part of the application procedure. The following questions can potentially be asked during the interview.

- Why did you choose to study in Germany?
- Why did you choose that specific programme in that specific institution?
- What is your current profession and how will this study programme influence your future career prospects?
- What are your short to medium term career goals?
- What is the course structure of your chosen programme (how many semesters, how many individual course modules will you be studying per semesters, what type of examinations you will be writing etc.)?
- When is the study programme starting?
- What will your master thesis be about?



- Do you have any idea about the town/state (location within Germany, i.e. East, West, North or South of Germany etc.)?
- How are you planning to finance your stay in Germany? Who is your sponsor?
